# Are you Smarter than a 5th Grader?

### (aka When I Went Back to 5th Grade)

With 30 fifth-graders and two teachers looking on, I recently had the opportunity to speak about what it means to be a right of way agent. My 11 year-old son Graham, a student at Barringer Academic Center in Charlotte, invited me to address

his class. It was the closing days of the school year and I suspect the teachers were needing to fill some time. I gladly accepted.

Anticipating the challenge of impressing these kids <u>and</u> filling an hour of time, I brought along my brother Jerry Muldowney, a PLS and PE, and owner of Boone, NC - based engineering firm, Dynan Group (insert shameless promotional business plug here). He had the electronic laser transit and siting tools that were certainly going to impress these bright kids much more than my tools of the trade - a 100 ft tape, a right of way agreement, a W-9

and a pen.



For my part, I shared why the job of right of way agent is the career that I chose or I should say chose me (see Angel Banks' article in the May/June Right of Way magazine). Anyway, I explained to the youngsters that I work in an office, but not all the time, I work outside, but not all the time, I review maps, but not all day, I review appraisals, but not all the time. I told them that I meet all types of people, but at times work alone. I conduct ownership research, but not all day long. You get the idea, our industry is varied and we seem to learn something new just about every day. I mentioned that if they can

find work in life that they enjoy doing then they'll likely have a good life.

I explained that we acquire land for all levels of government and utility companies among others. I informed them that sometimes we acquire strips of land that might only impact a property owner by reducing the size of their property by a small amount. One of the bright students asked what might happen if the government needs an entire parcel where someone lives. I explained the relocation process. I also shared the legality of how the government can "take" property from its citizens. That's the Fifth Amendment, as we all know.

Of course, there is always one kid.... "But what if they property owner won't sell his property", the class trouble maker asks. Well, I respond, they have to. Well, what if they won't. Ok, so this goes back and forth for a few minutes and I realize something. I'm going to be the lucky agent, to knock on this kid's front door 20 years from now seeking an easement. I love this business!

My brother took over from there, thankfully. We set up the transit and set two additional "stations" to form a triangle. We wanted to teach these young scholars how to measure an angle and to find the distance between two points. Each had the opportunity to look through the transit, and to then go to one of the two stations (the triangle points) and hold the "rod" or "stick". While another group then tried it.

The determination of the angles and distance was done by using the Laws of Co-sines. Brother Jerry, the civil engineer, is on the smart side of the family, obviously!

In conclusion, I must say, this was a very positive experience. After spending time chatting with these kids and answering their questions, I can say I have a faith in the youth of today, well, most of the youth. Eager to learn, asking questions, in all, very impressive.

**Treasurer's Report** – Julie McDonald emailed the Treasurer's report to John Yeagley who updated the group. The report contained balances as of August 6, 2012. The checking account balance was \$14,402.22. The Savings balance was \$50,953.78. Total assets were \$65,356.00

**PDC Report-** John Horne recognized Clark Hooper and James Bridge for receiving their SR/WA designations and presented their SR/WA plaques to both.

### **New Business:**

- Ben Ward Region 6 Chair asked if anyone is interested in volunteering for Region 6 chairs and if the chapter had any business for the region meeting in Los Angeles on September 22. The new Principles of Right of Way book is now a hard bound book and is available for purchase online at International's website. NCDOT has reached an agreement with IRWA and Chapter 31 to host about 30 courses over the next 3 to 4 years for their employees and they will invite outside participants to participate in the courses as well. IRWA membership is just shy of 10,000 people, 7500 members and 1300 affiliates' members from other countries. Fall forum will be held in Gulfport, MS on October 13, 2012 with education sessions on Friday and the meeting on Saturday. Spring forum will be in Nashville, Tenn.
- Two day SCDOT symposium will feature several Chapter 31 members giving presentations on behalf of the chapter.
- Discussion of what to do with the free memberships we will receive from International for achieving our 5% membership goal will be tabled until a later date.
- Motion was made by John Horne to have the seminar today count toward 4 hours of continuing education credit. Kevin Kilpatrick seconded and the motion passed.
- Motion to approve bylaws amendment that pertains to how we conduct our meetings in Article 3 Section 6 where we can conduct meetings by digital and electronic means. The motion passed unanimously.

If you would like to request an education course to be offered in 2013 please see Clark Hooper as soon as possible because he is almost ready to submit his final offerings for next year.



**2012 Fall Forum Report** (Summary Version)

The IUC has nearly doubled its membership over the last 12 months and has active Region Rep's from all 10 Regions, as well as a member from Chapter 83 in South Africa. There are IRWA efforts and discussions underway related to a possible future chapter in Uganda. Contacts have also been made with UETCL (Uganda Electric Transmission Company) related the potential for information sharing and IUC participation at some level.

Over the past year, members of the IUC have put together a new IRWA course: "Right of Way Acquisition for Electric Utility Projects" (C-218). It required a tremendous amount of time and effort and its submission to a copy editor is imminent. The plan is for the course to be available in 2013 for members.

The IUC is considering 14 possible sessions for the 2013 Conference in Charleston, WV, The range of topics includes: Dealing with Advocacy Groups, Paying for R/W With Annual Fees, Route Siting Issues, Converting "Sour Gas," Lignite Coal Projects, Encroachments Issues, Clean Energy Efforts in Africa, Public Outreach Plans, Cross Bore Issues (w/ ISEC), AC versus DC Transmission Power, Regional Transmission Planning, and Army Corp-Railroads issues.

The IUC now has an 'open' discussion group on LinkedIn and all members are invited to join in when they have a chance to keep abreast of the ongoing discussions of current affairs.

The IRWA has begun an outreach program involving our national governmental leadership. This involves contacting and meeting with US Senators, Members of the House of Representatives, and their staff members. By becoming a primary resource and point of contact on R/W issues for these leaders, we not only establish an extremely valuable network of contacts for the benefit of our membership, but our representatives become better informed and able to make better decisions about projects and funding issues.
