In a matter of minutes, Willie and I were back "On The Road Again" headed to Midland TX where I spent the weekend, toured The Petroleum Museum and Hall of Fame before finishing the assignment and returning to Grapevine. Life is good. I must say that Texas people are genuinely friendly and accommodating – much like homefolks in Union County. Plus, they don't seem to notice that I talk funny.
