Ruh Roh.....


You are too late to sign up! NO wait, you're not. Let's try this again.

The meeting was held at the McKim and Creed offices located at 8020 Tower Point Drive, Charlotte, NC. The meeting was called to order by President John Yeagley on Friday, May 17, 2013 at 10:22 a.m. Roll was taken by Secretary Buster Allen.

Minutes for Spring Seminar were reviewed, a few updates were noted, and there will not be an auction at the conference in West Virginia this year so our \$500 donation to the auction will not be made at this time. Buzz won a drawing for the free registration but Buzz transferred it to Dan Rushing.

Membership Report:

Membership has increased by 15 people this year. We now have 245 members.

Presidents Call:

"The We Want You Back" campaign will start soon which encourages members that have let their membership lapse to rejoin without paying the \$50 reinstatement fee.

Last year we achieved the membership growth but did not send in our quarterly reports as required by International to receive those free memberships

Education:

We completed 3 courses this year and we have 4 more planned this year, 2 with SCDOT in Columbia, SC. Schedule for the next 2 years are tentative with Education and PDC working together to bring classes which will enable our members to work towards their chosen career path.

PDC:

New designations are Right of Way Agent, Associate Right of Way Professional, Right of Way Professional and SR/WA. Nonmembers can work toward their certifications but can't complete their certification until they become members.

John Yeagley suggested a tie in to the committees with the quarterly seminars which focus on a couple of committees during the business portion of the meeting like Asset Management and Education or Utilities and PDC and have them give a 15-20 minute program update and general chapter updates. Chapter vice president will solicit help from members to come up with speakers/ideas for the quarterly seminars. Committee chairs to submit their reports to Secretary for each quarterly meeting so they can be posted on the website and newsletter.

New Business:

Chapter 31 Website committee consisting of Paul Thompson, Julie McDonald and Buzz Prescott will decide what to upload to the new website from the membership.

Recommendation made to send the chapter officers/committee chairs to class 219 on presentation skills paid for by the chapter as a way to become acclimated to leading the chapter in the future.

The IUC finalized a broad selection of very good sessions and speakers for the 2013 Educational Conference in Charleston, WV.


